Approve Agenda: Motion by Dan Kaiser, second by Carl Peter “Pete” Johnson to approve the November agenda. Motion carried.

Meeting Minutes: Motion by Dan Kaiser, second by Carl Peter “Pete” Johnson to accept the October 2022 meeting minutes. Motion carried.

Clerk Update: 911 blue sign order placed and received by Troy Montague. Election paperwork is under way for Township March 2023 elections. Requested LeTourneau Driveway letter from Attorney Couri and Ruppe – have not received letter as of today’s date.

Commissioner Report: Dan Dahlberg will be sworn in January 7, 2023.

IUP – Residential Kennel – Timothy and Katy Albrecht: Per the meeting minutes from the Sunrise Planning Commission asked how they are going to address the noise issues. The Albrecht's are planning on planting cypress that is said to grow 6 feet a year. They are in pretty dense woods as it is. Mr. Albrecht said that none of the dogs are left out overnight - even the livestock dogs. Part of the signed rescue agreement states that the dogs are not out overnight. Kate Albrecht is home all day. The dogs are kept inside when they are gone. They have newer fencing. The Albrecht's said that there was a complaint on the dogs and they are going through the process for an Interim Use Permit (IUP). The property due south have cleared trees to drive vehicles, trucks, ATV's, etc. A neighbor said that the dogs bark whenever they are outside, open a car door, put wood in the outdoor wood burner for heating their home. Timothy and Kate are out of rescuing dogs and as the dogs pass away they will not be replacing them. However, they do not feel they will ever be a zero dog home. Dogs barking are not outside of noise ordinance. They are trying to be respectful of shooting hours. All the dogs are spayed and neutered. These are rescue dogs that are considered undesirable due to health or can't be adopted.

There have been 3 conversations with neighbors, complaints about hunting which ended hostilely, began to cut large trees near property line. The Planning Commission asked to address how the neighbors address their vehicle noise. The neighbor said they burn over 10 cords of wood per year. The neighbor cut their own wood. The Sunrise Planning Commission said the issue of noise between the neighbors is at this point subjective, outside the scope of the immediate application, and can be addressed through the county process. The Albrecht's moved in April, 2021.

Katy has a home business – raising goats. Katy Albrecht is a stay at home mom and does homeschooling.

Board member asked how much do dogs bark. Timothy Albrecht said that generally when something sets them off. Board member said that neighbors should be courteous. Sunrise Board informed Timothy and Katy Albrecht that the IUP will now go to Chisago County. Board Member would like to see a schedule.

Joe Reichkitzer said that he has had conversations with Timothy Albrecht and said that Mr. Albrecht laughed at him.

Motion by Mark Osland, second by Eric Leivian to approve the IUP accepting the Sunrise Township Planning Commission recommendations with the following conditions:

- No dogs will be added to the property
- As individual dogs pass away they will not be replaced, and
- The Interim Use Permit (IUP) will sunset with the number of dogs in compliance with the current Chisago County Ordinance.

Motion carried with Jeske Noordergraaf voting nay.

Porta-Potties: All porta-potties are removed from Sunrise Township Park for the winter.

Along the river there is public parking and gravel will be placed for more parking. Patricia Peters is going to have her property surveyed along River Road which she would like Sunrise to help pay for. Ms. Peters may be interested in selling some of that property to Sunrise. Discussion took place regarding clearing around the ball field for more parking. 6 to possible 10 vehicles could park in the alleyway. Signage came in on River Road and Mill Street. Placement of the signs are inconvenient. Signage placement will be reassessed.

Rick Daas and Dan Dahlberg and Lori Aho – Solar: Rick Daas is looking for the support of Sunrise Township opposing proposed solar power plant. US Solar is proposing 1,000 acre solar power plant off of CR 57 (Government Road). Part of this solar power plant touches Sunrise Township. This particular site does not have a request for need. If the panels catch on fire, they are hazmat, the fire department can't spray water – they have to just watch them burn. Lori Aho states that the peoples land rights matter. This project is proposed to cost \$250 to \$300 million. Supposedly the farmer has signed an agreement. Motion by Jeske Noordergraaf, second by Dan Kaiser to pass resolution opposing proposed solar power plant in Sunrise Township. Motion carried.
